

Tibet Uprising Anniversary 2017: UK Events

Show your support for freedom and justice for Tibet and express solidarity with Tibetans inside Tibet by participating in events marking the anniversary of the 1959 Tibetan National Uprising.

On 10 March 1959, Tibetans in Lhasa rose up against China's military occupation. The Chinese army quashed the uprising and subsequent nation-wide rebellion, killing at least 87,000 Tibetans. Following the failed uprising, the Dalai Lama fled into exile and to this day the Tibetan people have had to endure China's brutal regime.

The Tibetan National Uprising is commemorated annually by exiled Tibetans and Tibet supporters, with events remembering its victims and those of the ongoing occupation, as well as calling for an end to China's oppressive policies in Tibet and for action from the international community. This year is the 58th anniversary of the Uprising.

The Cafe Campaign for a while has been against the demolition of Larung Gar, one of the largest and most significant centres of Buddhist learning in the world with a 10,000+ population - due to be halved by the Chinese government. What is left of it will be tightly controlled by a regime that has no legitimacy for Tibetans.

We have had replies from a few MP's but we need to be persistent to get the message across strongly. The implications of this destruction are vast. You can read about it/take action in the links below.

Cafe Momo will have cards to sign and send (Momo will add the stamp!) to your MP asking them to call on the Prime Minister to publicly meet the Dalai Lama and Sikyong when they next visit the UK - and to push for an end to Larung Gar's destruction.
